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### **PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD OPENS FOR GREENWAY PROJECTS**

The Niagara River Greenway Commission announced today that the public comment period has opened for the fourteenth round of projects. In addition, the Commission also announced that the public comment time will close end of the day on February 28, 2010.

Projects will be posted on their website at [www.niagaragreenway.org](http://www.niagaragreenway.org) beginning Tuesday, January 26, 2010 and public comment will be accepted until February 28, 2010. Comments may be submitted either at the website or by hard copy to the Commission at 2136 West Oakfield Road, Grand Island, New York 14072.

Projects in for consistency review are;

- City of Tonawanda-Eastern Park Kayak/Canoe Launch
- Buffalo Audubon Society-Niagara Greenway Environmental Education Program
- Forest Lawn Cemetery/Buffalo Olmsted Parks Conservancy-Scajaquada Creek Water Quality & Habitat Restoration Initiative
- Buffalo-Niagara Riverkeeper-Niagara Greenway Region Habitat Restoration Strategy

Once the public comment period has ended, the Niagara River Greenway Commission will review projects and on March 16, 2010 vote on the consistency of the projects in relation to the award winning Niagara River Greenway Plan. Project Sponsors will then be notified in writing of the Commissions findings along with copies of the public's comments. It is then the responsibility of the Project Sponsor to pursue funding with entities that award support. Funding requests can be made through local, state and federal agencies, foundations and various greenway standing committees.
