The Towns of Lewiston & Niagara Approve the Niagara River Greenway Plan

Grand Island, NY, March 16, 2007...The Niagara River Greenway Commission (NRGC) announces that the Town of Lewiston and Town of Niagara are the fifth and sixth Niagara County municipality to approve the Niagara River Greenway Plan. On Thursday, March 15th, the Town of Niagara passed a resolution and Friday, March 16th, the Town of Lewiston passed a resolution unanimously approving their support of the plan as submitted by the NRGC.

The Towns of Lewiston and Niagara become the ninth and tenth municipalities, to approve the plan. They join the Villages of Kenmore and Youngstown, Towns of Tonawanda, Grand Island Porter and Wheatfield the Cities of North Tonawanda and Tonawanda. The Commission, established by law in 2004, will aid in the planning and development of a greenway of interconnected parks, river access points and waterfront trails along the Niagara River from Lake Erie at Buffalo to Lake Ontario at the site of the historic Fort Niagara.
