Town of Tonawanda Approves Niagara River Greenway Plan

Tonawanda, NY, January 24, 2007...The Niagara River Greenway Commission (NRGC) announces the first municipality to sign off on the Niagara River Greenway Plan as the Town of Tonawanda. On Monday, January 22, the Town Board adopted a resolution in support of the plan as submitted by the NRGC.

In its resolution the Town of Tonawanda stated that they support the vision of the Niagara River Greenway that "The Niagara River Greenway is a world-class corridor of parks and landscapes that celebrates and interprets our unique natural, cultural, recreational, scenic and heritage resources and provides access to and connections between these important resources."

The Commission, established by law in 2004, will aid in the planning and development of a greenway of interconnected parks, river access points and waterfront trails along the Niagara River from Lake Erie at Buffalo to Lake Ontario at the site of the historic Fort Niagara.
