The Village of Youngstown Approves the Niagara River Greenway Plan

Grand Island, NY, February 9, 2007...The Niagara River Greenway Commission (NRGC) announces that the Village of Youngstown is the second Niagara County municipality to approve the Niagara River Greenway Plan. On Thursday, February 8th, the Village passed a resolution, unanimously approving their support of the plan as submitted by the NRGC.

The Village of Youngstown becomes the fifth municipality, to approve the plan. They join the Towns of Tonawanda and Grand Island and the Cities of North Tonawanda and Tonawanda. The Commission, established by law in 2004, will aid in the planning and development of a greenway of interconnected parks, river access points and waterfront trails along the Niagara River from Lake Erie at Buffalo to Lake Ontario at the site of the historic Fort Niagara.
